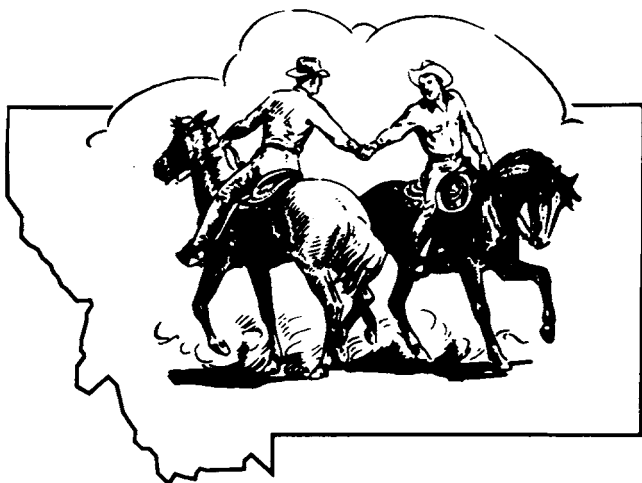

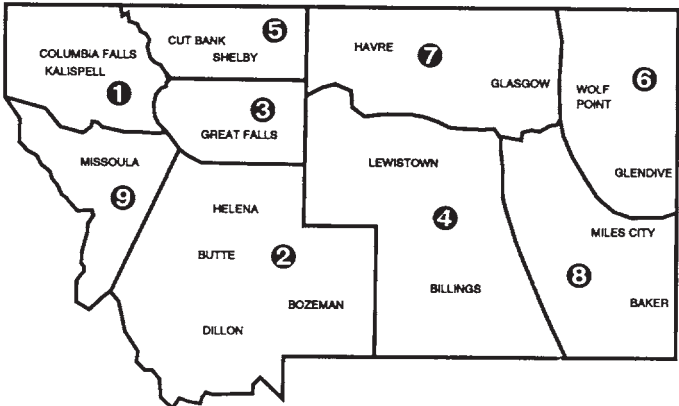

MONTANA SADDLE CLUBS ASSOCIATION BYLAWS

ARTICLE I

Section 1: The name of this organization is MONTANA SADDLE CLUBS ASSOCIATION.

ARTICLE II—Purposes & Objectives

Section 1: To promote and cultivate competition and friendly relationships within and between the saddle clubs throughout the State of Montana and elsewhere.

Section 2: To foster legislation for the benefit of the members and oppose legislation detrimental to the success of their organizations.

Section 3: To hold a two-day State Championship O-Mok-See annually and to adopt and enforce a uniform set of rules to be used in judging all contests conducted and/or sponsored by members of this association.

Section 4: To establish a calendar of dates for events to be held during the year by members of this association. Clubs to furnish MSCA with a list of dates of events by May 15 to be mailed to member clubs by June 1 by MSCA Secretary.

Section 5: To properly publicize the activities of members of the MSCA and in so doing to stimulate and increase interest in the recreational possibilities in the State of Montana.

ARTICLE III—Membership & Dues

Section 1: Active membership in the MSCA shall be granted to all organized saddle clubs in the State of Montana upon payment of the annual dues. Participation in the activities of the MSCA shall be restricted to members only.

Section 2: MSCA membership fee for all saddle clubs will be \$30 regardless of the size of the club. MSCA dues shall be handed in and or sent to the MSCA treasurer [AMENDED, 2003]. National Saddle Club Association dues are \$50, payable with MSCA dues.

Section 3: Individual members shall automatically become affiliated with the MSCA upon affiliation of their respective clubs with the MSCA.

ARTICLE IV—Meetings

Section 1: The MSCA Convention shall be the third weekend (Friday–Saturday) in February of each year. [AMENDED, 2000]

Section 2: Each club upon payment of their dues to the MSCA shall be entitled to one delegate empowered to vote on all actions and resolutions brought before the annual meeting. Dues to be paid prior to seating of delegate.

Section 3: The annual meeting of the MSCA shall be of such length and character as the officers agree and shall be held annually for the purpose of considering any business which may come before the MSCA and discussing such topics as may be deemed advisable to further its ends.

Section 4: Roberts Rules of Order shall govern the MSCA in all its proceedings and the action of its officers and directors.

Section 5: Place of the annual meeting is to be determined by a vote of the delegates at the annual convention.

Section 6: Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be held at such times and places as determined by the President and notices thereof shall be given in writing to each director at their postal address as it appears in the records of the MSCA at least fifteen days prior to such meetings, except at the State Convention or State O-Mok-See. [AMENDED, 1998]

Section 7: The fall Board of Directors meeting shall be held on the Friday of the MSCA State Convention, at a time to be determined by the President. [AMENDED, 2003]

ARTICLE V—Officers & Directors

Section 1: The MSCA shall be divided into districts. Each of these districts shall name one member to the board of Directors of the MSCA. The President, Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer and Immediate Past President of the MSCA shall also be members of the Board. Each director including the officers shall be empowered to vote as a delegate, with the President voting only in case of a tie vote (except that the President will vote by secret ballot in the election of officers if the total number of available votes are an even number). Each director must be from a MSCA member club and should be present at the annual meeting. Board of Directors shall include 3 state directors elected at large for 3-year terms—electing one each year. [AMENDED, 2003]

Section 2: The officers of the MSCA may be elected from the Board of Directors, delegates, or from the membership at large and shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer, and Historian. Officers shall serve one year or until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

Section 3: Elect two directors and one alternate to the National Saddle Clubs Association for a one-year term, who will automatically become directors of the MSCA, and whose alternate will be chosen from and by the Board of Directors if such action becomes necessary. The President will have the authority to appoint any additional allowable director to any national meeting.

Section 4: A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any directors meeting.

Section 5: Officers and directors shall serve without compensation.

ARTICLE VI—Duties of Officers & Directors

Section 1: The general supervision and direction of the affairs of the MSCA between regular meetings shall be vested in the Board of Directors. They shall audit the Treasurer's books and may fill any and all vacancies which may occur among the officers between annual meetings, and carry on all business and other activities of the MSCA.

Section 2: The President shall preside at all meetings of the MSCA and all meetings of the Board of Directors, and shall perform all duties of his office. The President shall have the power to appoint such committees as may be deemed necessary. The Vice President shall assume these duties in the absence of the President.

Section 3: The duty of the Secretary/Treasurer shall be to keep a record of all meetings of the MSCA and the Board of Directors and have copies available at the convention. The Secretary/Treasurer shall file the annual corporation papers with the State of Montana. The Secretary/Treasurer shall keep a record and have charge and custody of all funds. The Secretary/Treasurer will report upon the financial affairs of the MSCA when requested. The Secretary/Treasurer shall provide a copy of the official state placings to each district director at the fall board meeting. The Secretary/Treasurer shall deliver all funds and records to her successor at the annual meeting, or at the instruction of the Board of Directors. Secretary shall send out minutes of the meetings to the paid clubs. [AMENDED, 2000]

Section 4: All monies of the MSCA shall be handled by the Treasurer and deposited in a bank designated by the Board

of Directors. All checks shall be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the President.

Section 5: The duty of the Historian shall be to keep the state scrap book and a history of the MSCA. Scrapbooks older than five years are to be returned to respective club or historian.

Section 6: The officers and directors shall enforce the bylaws, rules and regulations, and activities of the MSCA.

Section 7: All paid rule books will be handed out at the spring board of director's meeting. Any paid books remaining will be mailed to the respective clubs COD.

Section 8: The officers and directors shall have the authority to increase entry fees by \$1 per event for a period of one year in case of financial hardship or instability of the association. Approval to be by a majority vote. [2006]

ARTICLE VII—Amendments

Section 1: The bylaws may be amended by a 2/3 vote of delegates present at the annual meeting, provided the number of voting delegates present represents not less than 51% of the previous year's annual members. [AMENDED]

Section 2: [HELENA 1967] All bylaws, rule, regulation and game recommendations MUST be sent to the MSCA Secretary with a postmark of December 1 or before. [AMENDED, 2002] Secretary is to mail a copy of the recommendations to all saddle clubs so their members will have an opportunity to discuss the proposals and instruct their club delegates how to vote at the state convention. If recommendations are not signed, they will not be sent out to clubs for consideration. An amendment to any recommendation concerning rules and regulations can be made at the convention directors meeting by a 2/3 vote of the Board of Directors. The original and the amended recommendation will then be brought to the convention floor and voted on. [AMENDED, 1996] The changes to become effective upon passage and approval. [AMENDED, 1998]

Section 3: These bylaws approved by a vote of the delegates at the MSCA annual meeting. These bylaws and amendments, including rules and regulations, shall supersede all previous bylaws and amendments.

MSCA CONVENTION REGULATIONS & GUIDELINES

MSCA RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Provide and assume cost of ribbons or certificates for the following:

A. Distance

B. Attendance award will be presented to the club who, by a head count, has the largest number of people “registered and paid” at the all-day session. Host club to be excluded.

C. Individual Club Scrap Book (each MSCA club shall also furnish material of the activities of that club for a section in the MSCA scrap book—page size 11" wide by 14" high).

D. Best Skit

E. Scrap Book Page (up to three pages with both sides used).

2. Provide host club with all necessary program information.

3. Board of Directors have the right to change the convention time and place in case the host club, for some reason, cannot meet MSCA requirements.

4. MSCA to pay \$200 to convention host. [AMENDED, 1998]

HOST CLUB RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Make all arrangements for luncheon, Saturday night banquet, and dance at a reasonable cost—to be approved by MSCA President.

2. Provide facilities, with ample room to seat all delegates, for the business session and banquet.

3. Provide a public address system for use at meeting and banquet.

4. Have arrangements, such as location and cost of convention, completed and mailed out to all known saddle clubs at least 60 days prior to the convention date.

5. Publish a convention program listing all MSCA officers, directors, and the order of business for the meeting.

6. If possible, provide equipment for showing O-Mok-See home video.

7. Provide all necessary help for registration—MSCA officers to assist where possible.

8. Keep an accurate record of those attending the convention, as well as those attending only the banquet. This list to be turned over to the MSCA Historian following the convention and placed in the state scrapbook.

9. Provide registration cards or ribbons for all in attendance.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Order of business will be as follows (games, nominating, auditing, and other committees should be appointed at the directors meeting preceding the convention):

A. Introduction of officers, directors, and club delegates.

B. Minutes, Treasurer's report, and auditing committee report.

C. State O-Mok-See bids read—Any club wishing to present a bid for the State O-Mok-See must notify the MSCA President in writing prior to the MSCA convention. The President will then contact the director of the area or will himself make an inspection of the grounds and facilities (final inspection to be no later than May 1st). [AMENDED, 2001]

D. Nominating committee slate of officers given and nominations taken from the floor. Each district director shall submit a slate of officers for the state election. These names shall be given to the nominating committee at the convention. The nominating committee can pick from these lists as well as the convention assembly. Names on the list must be the type of people interested in carrying on the work of the MSCA. Any person not present at the convention shall not be eligible for nomination.

E. Old business—recommendations, rule and bylaw changes.

F. Election of officers (reopen nominations from the floor).

G. Installation of new officers.

H. New business

a. Vote for the State O-Mok-See site—any club(s) bidding for the State O-Mok-See must request the host club entry fee (up to 50 cents per entry) and all other fees (camping, stalls, dance, etc.) excluding banquet meal cost, at the time of their bid.

b. Games committee report—games selected.

c. Establish budget for State O-Mok-See awards.

d. Bids for MSCA convention—vote on site.

e. New bylaw or rule changes (not presented under Article VII, *Section 2* in old business) may be brought before the delegates, but no action may be taken upon them until the next convention.

2. Each MSCA club shall submit a ballot (distributed to MSCA clubs by the MSCA Secretary prior to the convention) of games for each age group (in addition to the basic events) which will include the following:

3 events for Under 8 (*minimum of 1 pair event*)

3 events for 8–11 (*including a min. of 1 team or pair event*)

4 events for 12–15 (*minimum of 1 team and 1 pair event*)

4 events for adults (*minimum of 1 team and 1 pair event*)

The games committee will tally the ballots (only ballots of clubs whose dues are paid will be counted. All ballots must be received before the beginning of the morning session of the MSCA convention). Games for the State O-Mok-See will be selected on the basis of the most votes. Ties shall be broken, if necessary, by a vote of the convention delegates. Additions or deletions to the list of games shall be determined by ballot vote count.

3. Each saddle club will place their order for rule books they require at the convention and pay for them when ordered.

4. When voting on recommendations at the state convention, a motion will be made merely to vote on a recommendation instead of to accept or not accept thereby omitting the confusion of voting on a double negative.

5. Not vote on recommendations just amend on Friday night and go through everything completely on Saturday,

6. The plurality system of voting will be used except for bylaws.

7. Any club wanting more information concerning the convention should contact the host club.

STATE O-MOK-SEE RULES & REGULATIONS

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The State O-Mok-See shall be held on Labor Day weekend as a permanent date. Events shall be started at 8:00am each day unless the board of directors deems it necessary to start the show one or two hours earlier.

2. The State O-Mok-See committee, consisting of all members of the Board of Directors present at the show, shall be the governing body.

3. Any number of MSCA clubs may host the State O-Mok-See.

4. Four basic races shall be run at the State O-Mok-See. Pole Bending, National Flag, and Key Race shall be run for all age groups. Graduated Barrel & Stake (*under 8, 8–11*) and Barrel & Stake (*12–15, men and women*) shall be alternated each year with cloverleaf as the fourth basic game.

5. The National Anthem or Pledge of Allegiance to be used at the beginning of all O-Mok-Sees and due respect be paid to the flag.

6. Race times must be posted for each event. [1997]

ENTRY INFORMATION

1. Age divisions are as follows: Under 8, 8–11, 12–15, 16–30 Women, 31–45 Women, 46+ Women, 16–39 Men, and 40+ Men. Contestants 16 & older compete in partner or team races in one division: Adults. A contestant will ride all year in the age group decided by their age on January 1st.

2. A \$10 per club fee will be charged, money to go to the host club.

3. An entry fee of \$3 per contestant, per event will be charged. An additional fee of up to 50 cents (host club fees are not state entry fees) per entry may be charged to defray costs for the host club (must be requested by the host club at the time of their bid). [AMENDED, 2001]

4. Entries and entry fees for the State O-Mok See must be postmarked thirty days prior to the show date. Double entry fees will be charged for post entries. All fees to be paid by club check, money order, or cashier's check and made payable to MSCA (individual party checks will not be accepted).

5. No contestant may compete against himself, and must ride under his own name. No contestant will be allowed to ride under another contestant's entry fee.

6. Program changes may be made from 6:30am to 7:30am Saturday morning for Saturday's show and prior to 10:00pm Saturday evening for Sunday's show. All contestants must ride according to the program.

7. In any team or pair event, if a contestant is injured, or in the event of an emergency after the cutoff time for program changes at the State O-Mok-See, contestant's partners may substitute another eligible contestant at single entry fees to fill out their team by a written request from the team captain to be approved by the Board of Directors. There will be a refund of entry fees in the event of an injured horse or personal injury verified by a veterinarian or doctor's statement.

8. Saddle clubs must have dues paid 30 days prior to the show to be eligible to participate.

9. Each club must submit the name of a qualified judge on their entry form.

10. Programs shall be ordered and paid for along with entry fees.

11. Any bona fide saddle club horse may be ridden by any member of that saddle club. A horse may be ridden only once in any event.

12. Entry fees to be refunded by the Treasurer upon submission of doctor/vet statement.

13. Each club shall include a list of all members (specifically those competing in the MSCA championship show) with their MSCA entries. [ADDED, 2002]

14. Any riding member must have a birth certificate or lawful identification in to the MSCA secretary with entry. (The MSCA secretary to keep on file.) [ADDED, 2002]

15. MSCA will allow businesses to submit ads to a MSCA representative to be arranged for printing and inclusion with the State Program. Once the MSCA representative has arranged ads, the ad pages will be mailed to the State Secretary to be inserted into the state race program. Ad pages must be received by date set by the State Secretary. [ADDED, 2007]

16. All royalty and race sponsor names will be included in the MSCA race program. [ADDED, 2007]

EQUIPMENT & ATTIRE

1. All events shall be ridden with western equipment, western attire, and ridden in a conventional western manner. Western shirt must be fastened with closure at start of race. [AMENDED, 2003]

2. Only western style boots, heeled western equestrian sport shoes and moccasins will be allowed as footwear. T-shirts, sweat-shirts, shells, poorboys and low-necked blouses will not be considered western wear. Women may wear western sleeveless shirts.

3. Where the rules read plural of rein, split reins are to be used. No two reins from the same side of the bit will be permitted in any events.

4. Quirts and bats can be used with no length restrictions as long as races are run in individual or 30 foot lanes. Otherwise bats may not exceed 22 inches in length.

5. The use of a halter rope, neckrope, third rein, or other gimmick in any event will be a disqualification.

6. Safety helmets will be allowed in any O-Mok-See event.

7. Baseball caps and visors are to be acceptable at any O-Mok-See competition.

POINTS & AWARDS

1. Points to be distributed as follows: *1st*: 100 points, *2nd*: 90 points, *3rd*: 80 points, *4th*: 70 points, *5th*: 60 points, *6th*: 50 points, *7th*: 40 points, *8th*: 30 points, *9th*: 20 points, *10th*: 10 points. Team races will split points.

2. Awards will be given to 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th place winners in each event and participation awards will be given to all Under 8 and 8–11 riders who did not place in any event at the State O-Mok-See. An award will be presented to the high point champion in each age group. The award will be left up to the discretion of the Board of Directors. 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th place high point riders in each age group will also receive awards. [AMENDED, 2006]

3. In the event of a tie for the high point title, the contestant with the greater number of first places shall be the winner. If a tie still exists, the next place i.e. 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th shall be used until the tie is broken. If the tie cannot be broken, duplicate awards will be given [AMENDED, 1998].

4. All contestants will ride for their own saddle club. Each will ride for individual points.

5. There will be a first and second place high point club award presented. The high point club will be determined by taking the points of the two top riders from that club in each event for each age group. In team and pair events, only points from the top two pairs or teams per club, per age group would qualify for the high point award.

ARENA SPECIFICATIONS

1. A regulation distance of 165 feet between starting line and turning line shall be used in all games unless otherwise specified.

2. All events shall be run with four lanes unless otherwise designated. Lane #1 is on the left as the contestant faces the starting line. All Lanes to be marked at the end with at least 1-foot high number.

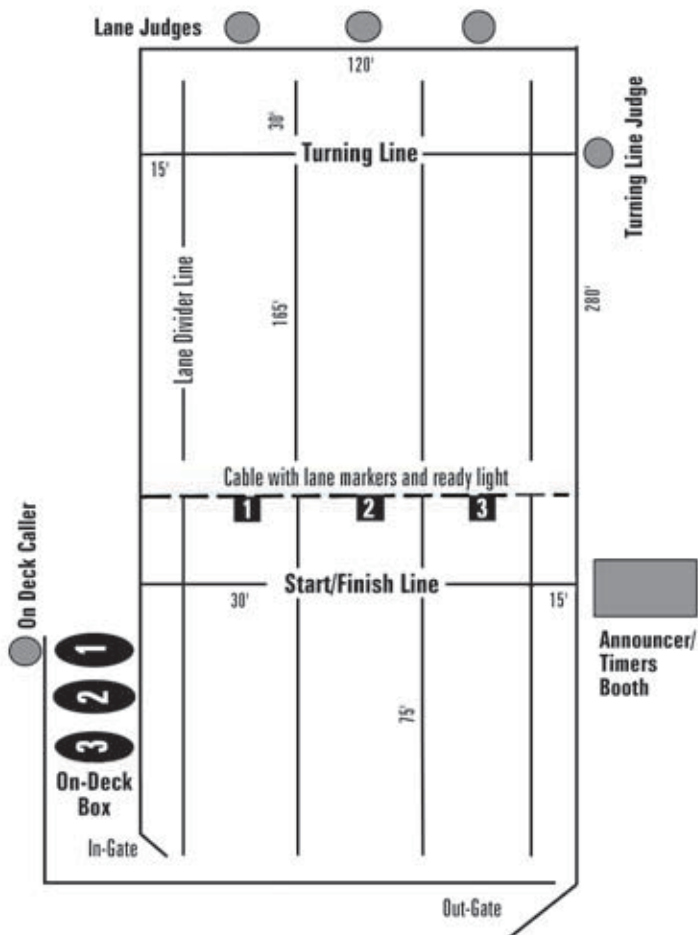
3. Maximum slope of arena shall not exceed 1½% grade in any direction. Arena shall be free from rocks and must be worked at least 3 inches deep. Arena will be inspected by O-Mok-See Board of Directors. In all races the turning lines shall be raked at the completion of each age group and after every 10 heats in any age group. Can be raked more often if the Board of Directors deems necessary.

4. Minimum size of arena will be 120 feet wide and 280 feet long, permitting only three (3) lanes. Start/finish line to be a minimum of 75 feet from fence. Lanes to be 30 feet wide with a minimum of 15 feet between lane divider line and the fence. Lane lines to run from fence behind starting line and extend to 30 feet beyond turning line. Contestants

must start and stop in their lanes. When a contestant is finished with their run they must remain in their lane until the other contestants have completed their runs. All lines shall be clearly marked with lime.

5. Optional gate opening: All openings into the arena to be closed or fenced off with the exception of the in-gate, which can be open-ended as described: barrier to be installed to extend to left and right of in-gate. Riders entering the arena will do so to the left side of the barrier. Riders exiting the arena will do so to the right of the barrier. Riders leaving lanes before instructed or before the end of their heat shall constitute disqualification. [AMENDED, 2003]

PROPERTIES (*See specific event description for more information*)

1. All properties to be painted white unless otherwise specified.

2. Thirty (30) gallon barrels to be used in all events unless otherwise specified.

3. Pole bending stakes to be 1 to 2 inches full round and five feet high. Pole Bending bases to be solid rubber Quarter Horse bases only, a maximum of 15 inches in diameter.

4. A uniform baton of 5/8-1 inch in diameter and 12 inches in length to be used for all events unless otherwise specified.

5. In all events, properties shall be set evenly so horses going either left or right will have an equal opportunity.

6. All properties not in use to be kept out of the arena.

START

1. The start of the race shall be controlled by the announcer.

2. Self start-contestants will endeavor to make as even a start as possible. No gong or starting device will be used. Contestants must wait to go until announcer indicates the race may begin.

3. Self-start to be used in all races unless otherwise specified.

4. Once the announcer has started the race, riders shall accept their properties as set.

RE-RIDES, TIES

1. Re-rides are given if a contestant or horse is interfered with before a disqualification occurs if the interference; 1) possibly hinders a contestant's performance; or 2) causes a disqualification. Contestants shall be given two chances to make a qualified

ride. Re-rides for interference may change horses. The re-ride shall be taken at the end of the event corresponding with the contestant's age group or at the end of the next group running the same event. If their group is the last age group to run this event the re-ride shall be run at the end of the event. [AMENDED, 2003]

2. [AMENDED, 1998] Anytime a contestant makes a qualified ride and there is a power failure, mechanical difficulty, timer interference by another contestant or operator's mistake, a contestant will be allowed two chances to make a qualified ride. In the event of timer failure or timer interference, a different horse may be used and the re-ride shall be taken at the end of the event corresponding with the contestant's age group. Whenever there is a timer failure/timer interference, the announcer may not stop the contestant(s) once they have started since the contestant(s) must still make a qualified ride before being awarded a re-ride.

3. [AMENDED, 1998] Ties to be run off unless both contestants decide to flip a coin. Loser to take lower position. In case only one wishes a runoff and the other refuses, the one refusing shall take the lower position. Contestants are competing for placings only and times will not go into the record book. There shall be a one (1) second penalty imposed for each property knocked over in tie runoffs only. All ties to be run off at the end of that section. Riders may not change horses for tie runoffs.

4. Applies only on decision from three-man rules committee. Re-ride to be given at earliest convenience for show. Benefit of doubt to go to rider. [AMENDED, 2003]

JUDGING OF EVENTS

1. Judges have the power to disqualify a contestant for the following (Judge's decision is final):

A. General disqualification for not following the rules of the event (*see specific event description for more information*).

B. For completely ("completely" meaning all four feet of one horse at the same time, including pair or team events) crossing over lane divider line. If going out of lane far enough to interfere with another contestant, the one interfered with shall be awarded a re-ride (see re-rides, ties; #1).

C. For knocking over any property (property being anything used in an event that is movable). Any property that is

standing in an upright position which makes contact with the ground with its top portion and returns to an upright position shall be deemed a property knocked over. Timers that are bumped or knocked over shall be a disqualification.

D. For intentionally hitting a horse with a property or baton.

E. For poor sportsmanship, intoxication, or unruly conduct.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. No contestant shall be disqualified for a rule unless specifically called for in the rule book.

2. A left-handed person may ride the opposite direction from rules applying to a right-handed rider in any event unless otherwise specified.

3. The turning line must be crossed by horse and rider in all races except those specifically prohibiting it.

4. In all events, rider(s) must be astride horse when crossing finish line unless otherwise specified. Astride shall be defined as one leg on each side of the saddle or horse. Leg shall be defined as the rider's knee joint even or across the spine of the horse. [2002]

5. In partner events that require pick-up, rider(s) must make an attempt to mount behind the turning line. An attempt shall be defined as making contact with horse and/or rider.

6. When a rule states rider must dismount that means both feet on the ground. [2005]

7. A contestant shall be disqualified for intentionally steadying a set property with their hand in any event unless otherwise specified.

8. A horse may be led through the in-gate only. The person leading the horse must then leave the arena immediately for all age groups and events.

9. No intoxicating beverages will be allowed in the arena or on the fence during the show.

10. Contestants will be given three calls by the on-deck caller to report for their heat, with no more than three heats to be called at a time [AMENDED 1998]. If a contestant does not report within the three calls, they will be disqualified.

11. The MSCA reserves the right to remove any horse owner contestant and/or present for the remainder of the show, and said person shall forfeit their entry fee and other fees and awards without the MSCA assuming any liability for compensation. The reasons for removal may include, but not be limited to: malicious mischief, vandalism, abuse

of horses, unsportsmanlike conduct, or any act that would negatively affect the Association or its members. If said act occurs at the banquet and/or dance the individual shall be suspended from participating in the following year's State O-Mok-See. [AMENDED, 2002]

12. In team or pair events one change will be accepted per team or pair. Any other changes will be charged a \$5 fee per change with the exception of injury. [2005]

13. Riders must ride in designated lane, if another contestant rides in your lane you must refuse to ride. Cannot ride in the incorrect lane. Rider will be disqualified unless in proper lane. [2006]

STATE O-MOK-SEE / HOST CLUB RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Provide lime, lane markers, and all necessary properties for O-Mok-See events.

2. Provide a public address system. Provide on-deck caller with a separate auxiliary P.A. system. Provide a direct means of communication between the on-deck caller and announcer's stand.

3. Provide arena director—approved by MSCA President.

4. Provide two-foot square starting flag for 300 yard race only.

5. Make all arrangements for Sunday night meal and dance at as near cost as possible. Banquet is not mandatory.

6. Profit from any concession shall go to the host club. No alcoholic beverages may be sold on the grounds during the show.

7. Provide adequate watering of arena to eliminate dust.

8. Provide spectator insurance to cover liabilities.

9. An ambulance or suitable conveyance with personnel capable of administering first aid to be on hand throughout the show.

10. Provide elevated stands for lane judges and timers. When using stopwatches, timer's stand should be constructed in such a manner that each timer is in direct line with the starting line. Each lane judge stand to have a 12-inch high lane number directly below the judge.

11. Mark the arena with colored ribbons or tape so arena crew does not have to measure before each event.

12. Provide adequate help in the arena during the show.

STATE O-MOK-SEE & MSCA RESPONSIBILITIES

1. O-Mok-See committee shall pick timers, head timer, judges, lane official, and three-person rules committee.

2. O-Mok-See committee shall be in charge of announcer and on-deck caller. [AMENDED, 1997]

3. Provide and assume cost of awards for the State O-Mok-See. Present awards Sunday night during the banquet and/or dance.

4. Furnish entry forms to saddle clubs, master time sheets for registration, timing pads, and electric timers or stop watches. Entry forms to have space for team captain and judge. MSCA to have uniform time pads and master time sheets for registration to be used at the State O-Mok-See. These forms to be made available to any member club on a cost basis for local meets.

5. A list of games to be run at the State O-Mok-See to be presented to the press for publication. This list to be sent to MSCA clubs at least 60 days prior to the State O-Mok-See. A lineup of the games will be included with the list. [AMENDED, 1997]

6. Provide contestants with a schedule of events that may be folded and kept in pocket.

7. Provide registration committee and clerks. Registration forms to be in triplicate providing copies for announcer, on-deck caller, and clerks.

8. MSCA to be financially responsible for the programs, collection of entry fees, purchase of awards, and film. Host club will be responsible for all other expenses and shall keep all other proceeds.

9. Pads and pencils, or other means of communication, made available to lane judges.

10. Master time sheet to be reproduced for a program at the State O-Mok-See, cost to be assumed by the MSCA.

11. At the State O-Mok-See, when a new record is set in an event, time will be placed in the MSCA rule book.

12. Provide adequate help to run games quickly and smoothly.

DUTIES OF O-MOK-SEE OFFICIALS

ANNOUNCER

1. Prior to each event, reads the rules of the event.
2. From master time sheet, calls event number, heat number, lane number, contestant's name, saddle club, etc. for that heat.
3. Signals in-gate man when arena is ready for the next heat.
4. Controls start of race, tells contestants when to start.
5. Checks with judges and announces disqualifications.
6. Announces times of each heat as soon as possible.
7. Announcer/timer's booth shall be off-limits to unauthorized persons. Authorized persons include MSCA officers, clerks, rules committee, official timers, and team captains (persons who are directly involved in running and putting on the State O-Mok-See).

HEAD TIMER

1. Keeps timers alert at start of race.
2. Signals timers when they may clear electric timers/watches.
3. Settles all disputes among timers.

TIMERS

1. Qualified and approved by O-Mok-See committee.
2. Use electric timers with qualified operators, whenever possible. Electric timers will not be set on barrels at the State O-Mok-See.
3. If stopwatches are used, following procedures enacted:
 - A. Timers to be in a stand directly in line with starting line, elevated one above the other.
 - B. Only synchronized watches to be used.
 - C. Keep watches fully wound every third or fourth heat.
 - D. Take slack out of plunger just before race starts.
 - E. Watches are started when horse's nose hits the starting line. Watch to be stopped when horse's nose hits the finish line at the finish of the race, unless otherwise specified.
4. Clear electric timers/watches upon signal from head timer.

5. Timers may disqualify in their own lanes at the starting line end of the arena only, for a rule infraction. Timers may not disqualify for a horse crossing over a lane divider line.

CLERKS

1. Two clerks working show at all times.
2. Record times of each heat for each lane on master time sheet. A time shall be recorded whether or not a disqualification occurs.
3. Records the following on time pad: event number, heat number, time (after checking clock reading), disqualification and reason from the judge.
4. One clerk to check the recording of the other clerk.

JUDGES

1. Qualified and approved by O-Mok-See committee.
2. Have rule book at all times. Knows rules. Checks rules of each event before event starts.
3. Have a pen and program to write the reason for disqualification after each heat. Judges must sign full name and club at the end of last heat judged. [AMENDED, 1998]

LANE JUDGES

1. To be at turning line end of the arena, elevated and centered in line with their respective lanes. Position to be as far back from turning line as possible.
2. Lane judge to be in a sitting position until a disqualification occurs in his lane, judge then steps on lever of disqualifying flag. Flag to be of red material and constructed so as to flip up when lever is stepped on. After announcer acknowledges disqualification, lane judge releases the flag.
3. Two judges on elevated stands outside of arena on the finish line end of arena to judge crossing over lane divider lines.

TURNING LINE JUDGE

1. Turning line judge (to be taken from the list of lane judges when needed) to be in a direct line with turning line. Checks that all horses and contestants cross turning line unless otherwise specified (particularly watches key race). Tells lane judge if there is disqualification. Two turning line judges are to be used for all partner/team events that require mount/dismount behind the turning line.

RULES COMMITTEE

1. Committee shall consist of three members. No officers may be a member of the 3-person rule committee.

2. Only to accept written complaint from the team captain.

3. After checking complaint its decision is final.

4. One member of the rules committee to be available at all times.

5. The team captain shall become a nonvoting delegate to the rules committee when turning in a protest for his team. The captain's purpose is to debate the protest only, he shall not have a vote when the rules committee makes its decision. The captain has the option of not debating the protest with the committee. All written complaints must be accompanied by \$20 fee, which will be refunded if the committee rules in favor of the complaint. If the complaint is denied, the fee will be retained by the MSCA. [AMENDED, 2003]

6. Any complaints must be handed in to the officials before the completion of the next age group's race.

7. A complaint can only be written by a contestant regarding his/her ride ruling or that of a parent if ruling concerns a minor. Complaints written by a contestant, spectator, or anyone else against another contestant will NOT be considered by committee. [ADDED 2004]

GATE MAN

1. Upon signal from announcer, in-gate man lets contestants in on-deck box into arena immediately after preceding heat is finished.

2. Out-gate man to let no contestant out of gate until all contestants in heat are before gate with horses under control.

ON-DECK CALLER

1. Has copy of the master time sheet for each event. This to be a copy of the same sheet given announcer and clerks.

2. Keeps contestants of each heat ready. Keeps one heat in on-deck box and one heat ready to enter on-deck box at all times.

3. Must have a separate P.A./speaker system.

MSCA BASIC RACES

BARREL & STAKE RACE (12–15, *Women, Men*). [AMENDED, 1997] Rider races to barrel placed 30 feet from starting line, containing three stakes, picks up one stake and deposits stake in second barrel on turning line, continuing until all stakes are placed in second barrel, and races back across finish line. Rider must keep barrel to right or left at all times. Hitting horse with stake disqualifies rider. Wooden or plastic stakes 5 feet long, full round 1 to 2 inches [AMENDED, 1999] in diameter, of a light weight, and thirty (30) gallon barrels painted white to be used. All stakes used in the event must be of the same size and material. Contestants are disqualified for knocking over a barrel or dropping a stake outside of a barrel. If a contestant accepts the position of the stakes after the contestant has them positioned, and a stake falls out of the barrel after the ready light is on, they will be disqualified.

CLOVERLEAF RACE (*All Ages*). Contestant may start to either right or left barrel first, but must make one right turn and two left turns, or one left turn and two right turns. Barrels should be at least 20 feet from the fence. Regulation distance of 165 feet from starting line to turning line. Forty (40) feet from starting line to barrels #1 and #2, 75 feet between barrels #1 and #2. Knocking over barrel or not following the pattern disqualifies contestant. Contestant may use a running start. Start/finish line shall be 30 feet wide and shall have a pole bending pole covered with 4"×5' red canvas sock at each end of line. Contestants must start and finish by crossing line between poles. Thirty (30) gallon barrels with closed end up with garden hose on rim to be used. Barrels #1 and #2 to be set 22½ feet from each side of the lane that electric timers are set in and barrel #3 to be centered on the turning line in the middle (15 ft) of the lane the timer is set in. No cloverleaf horses will be allowed to run in or out of any gates.

GRADUATED BARREL & STAKE RACE (*under 8, 8–11*). Rider races to barrel placed 30 feet from starting line, containing one stake for Under 8 or two stakes for 8–11, picks up one stake and deposits stake in second barrel on turning line, continuing until all stakes are placed in second barrel, and races back

across finish line. Rider must keep barrel to right or left at all times. Hitting horse with stake disqualifies rider. Wooden or plastic stakes 5 feet long, full round 1 to 2 inches in diameter [AMENDED, 1999], of a light weight, and thirty (30) gallon barrels painted white to be used. All stakes used in the event must be of the same size and material. Contestants are disqualified for knocking over a barrel or dropping a stake outside of a barrel. If a contestant accepts the position of the stakes after the contestant has them positioned, and a stake falls out of the barrel after the ready light is on, they will be disqualified. [BASIC ADDED, 2000]

KEY RACE (*All Ages*). Two pole bending stakes on the turning line five feet apart. Between the starting line and turning line there are two more stakes ten feet from the turning line and five feet apart. These stakes to be in line with stakes on the turning line. All stakes to be covered with 4" x 5' red canvas socks. Contestant races between stakes, across turning line, turns and reverses course back between the stakes to finish line. Contestant is disqualified for knocking over any stakes.

NATIONAL FLAG RACE (*All Ages*). A flag in a gallon can of sand is centered on a 30-gallon barrel placed on the turning line. Contestants race around barrel, picking up flag and return across finish line with flag visible. Flag to be white, 9 inches square, attached to a stick 5/8 inches in diameter and 18 inches long. Flag to be sticking straight up in center of can. Knocking over barrel or can disqualifies.

POLE BENDING (*All Ages*). Each contestant shall have a line of six poles, five feet high, 1 to 2 inches [AMENDED, 1999] in diameter and painted white. All lanes to have uniform poles set 21 feet apart. Last pole to be centered on turning line. Contestant races to pole on the turning line, makes a left or right turn, bends through and back, weaving poles, then races back across finish line. Disqualification for knocking over a pole or touching pole with hand.

MSCA APPROVED RACES

ARENA RACE (*All Ages*). Rider mounted at start, races to pole bending stake centered on turning line, makes a right or left turn around stake and races back to finish line. Knocking over pole disqualifies rider. [AMENDED, 2002]

BARREL POLE RACE (*All Ages*). A barrel is centered in the lane 60 feet from the start/finish line. Three poles are centered in lane, the first on the turning line and the other two poles set 21 feet apart toward start/finish line. At signal, contestant races to barrel and circles it right or left, weaves poles down and back, circles barrel again either way, then races across finish line.

BUTTON SEWING RACE (*12–15, Adults: Pairs—Man & Woman/ Boy & Girl*). Man or boy stands beside horse at starting line with envelope in hand containing button and thread fastened with needle in flap (buttons of uniform size and thread of same length). Woman or girl stands at turning line in lane opposite her partner. Man or boy runs on foot, leading horse to woman or girl, hands her the envelope, she opens it, threads the needle, sews button on man or boy's sleeve, he mounts and races back across finish line. Buttons to be inspected by judges. Four hole buttons with one thread through each hole.

BUTTON SEWING RACE "A" (*12–15, Adults: Pairs*). Same rules and regulations as Button Sewing Race (see above).

CHANGE RACE (*12–15, Adults: Pairs—Man & Woman/Boy & Girl*). Man or boy mounted on bareback horse, races to his partner who is standing beyond the turning line with blanket in hand. Both saddle horse, woman or girl mounts, man or boy mounts behind her and race back across the finish line.

CHANGE RACE "A" (*12–15, Adults: Pairs*). Same rules and regulations as Change Race (see above).

COWBOY FLAG RACE (*All Ages*). 2 poles and 2 barrels (open ends up) alternating placed 40 feet apart from the turning line to the starting line. Starting with a barrel on the turn line. A flag

to be placed at the tip of each pole. Rider races to 1st pole and picks up the flag and deposits the flag in the 1st barrel, races to the 2nd pole and picks up flag and deposits flag in 2nd barrel, turning barrel on turn line, races home. Rider must keep poles and barrels on the same side at all times. Contestant are disqualified for knocking over barrel(s) and/or pole(s), dropping the flag(s) and breaking the pattern.

COWHIDE RACE (*Adults: Pairs*). Contestant stands with both feet on the ground beside horse at starting line. At signal, mounts and races to partner, who stands ten feet beyond turning line, beside cowhide, with loose end of 30- to 35-foot rope in hand, the other end tied to cowhide. After handing rope to rider, the horseless contestant sits on cowhide and is dragged across the finish line by rider. The rope must not be tied hard and fast to the saddle horn.

COWHIDE, MOUNTED (*Adults: Pairs*). Mounted rider at starting line races to partner, who stands ten feet beyond turning line, beside cowhide, with 20- to 30-foot rope, loose end in hand, the other end tied to the cowhide. After handing the rope to rider, horseless person gets on cowhide and is dragged across finish line by rider. The rope must not be tied hard and fast to the saddle horn.

CUT BANK RIBBON RACE (*Under 8, 8–11: Pairs*) Both riders mounted riding double, race across turning line to horse holder standing 5 feet beyond the turning line. Without the assistance of the horse holder, the riders dismount. Riders pick up Pair Sack ribbon lying on the ground directly behind the turning line centered in the lane and race on foot back across finish line holding ribbon between them. Time ends when first runner crosses line. Disqualification for dropping ribbon before crossing finish line and receiving assistance from holder in dismounting. (To ensure proper timing, place arms in air when crossing finish line.) [CBSC, 1996]

CUT BANK TEAM POLES (*8–11, 12–15, Adults*). A baton relay race. Four riders to a team, all start mounted, two riders at the starting line end of arena, two riders at the turning line end of the arena. The first rider starts at the ready light and weaves once through four pole bending poles set 30 feet apart, centered in the lane, to the turning line end of the

arena. (The first pole 35 feet from the starting line.) Rider #1 hands the baton to rider #2 behind the turning line. Rider #2 races back toward the starting line weaving through the poles on the way, hands the baton to rider #3 behind the starting line, who then races toward the turning line weaving once through the poles and handing the baton to rider #4 behind the turning line, who then weaves through the poles and races across the finish line. Rider #4 to wear a red arm band on arm closest to announcer as he/she starts race. Baton to be state approved. Hand-offs must be made behind starting line and turning line. All riders to remain at the end of arena they finish their part of the race at until all lanes have finished. [1994]

DEVIL'S COWHIDE (*Adults: Pairs*). Mounted contestant pulls rider on cowhide from self start around a 30-gallon barrel centered on the turning line, makes a right turn around barrel and races back across finish line. One unmounted person will be allowed in the arena with each cowhide team for safety purposes. Hide rider must cross finish line in contact with the cowhide. Disqualified if barrel is knocked over, not making a right turn around barrel, or if ropes are tied hard and fast to saddle horn. The cowhide drags are made by securing a 2" x 4" board about 3 feet long to one side of the cowhide and tying a piece of rope about 4 feet long to the center of the board, leaving loose end for hide rider to hold onto. New 8-inch rope to be placed on the cowhide for State O-Mok-See. A 20-foot rope will be used for this event. The race will be run in only two lanes per heat. A helmet is mandatory for the person riding the hide.

EXCHANGE RACE (*12-15, Adults: Pairs*). First rider starts mounted, races to second rider who is standing behind turning line. After crossing turning line, first rider dismounts; and second rider mounts horse and races back across finish line. Riders may assist each other. Disqualifications for not crossing turning line, riders losing contact with horse, not being astride horse at finish line or not making an attempt to mount behind turning line.

EXPRESS RESCUE (*12-15, Adults: Pairs*). Rider mounted, races across turning line where partner is standing, picks up partner and races back across finish line. Riders to be astride horse at finish.

FIGURE EIGHT BARRELS (*All Ages*). A barrel is centered on the turning line and another barrel is set 75 feet toward the starting line in the center of the lane. Contestant is mounted, races to turning line, makes a left or right turn around the barrel, races to the second barrel, making the opposite turn around the second barrel, returns to first barrel on turning line and makes another left or right turn (same as first turn) and races to finish line. Contestant is disqualified for breaking the pattern or knocking over a barrel. [1998]

FIGURE EIGHT STAKE RACE (*All Ages*). A pole bending stake is centered on the turning line and another pole bending stake is set 60 feet toward the starting line and in line with the first stake. Contestant is mounted, races to turning line, makes a left or right turn around pole bending stake, goes to the other pole bending stake, making the opposite turn around second stake, returns to first stake on turning line and makes another left or right turn (same as first turn) and races to finish line. Contestant is disqualified for breaking the pattern or knocking over a stake.

5-TR (8–11, 12–15, *Adults*). 5 per team—4 riders mounted, one person on foot standing past turning line with four red socks. Rider #1 races past turning line, person on foot hands 1 red sock to rider, rider rides back across starting line. Rider #2, who has moved up to starting line, follows same procedure, as do riders #3 and #4. Race finishes when last rider with sock crosses finish line. Team disqualified for losing a red sock or if a rider crosses starting line before preceding rider crosses line with red sock. Rider #4 to wear red arm band on arm closest to announcer as he/she starts race. [1994]

GO AND UNSADDLE (*Women*). Rider starts unmounted, rides to turning line, dismounts and unsaddles. Time ends when blanket or pad hits the ground.

GO AND UNSADDLE-SADDLE AND GO (*Adults: Pairs—Man & Woman*). The woman races to turning line, where man stands, unsaddles the horse unassisted and places blanket or pad on top of saddle. Man saddles the horse, mounts and races back across finish line.

GO AND UNSADDLE-SADDLE AND GO "A" (12–15, *Adults: Pairs*). Same rules and regulations as Go and Unsaddle-Saddle and Go (see above).

GRETNA GREEN (12–15, Adults: Pairs—Man & Woman/Boy & Girl). Woman or girl stands behind turning line, in lane opposite her partner. Man or boy mounted, holding reins of his partner's horse. Man or boy leads horse to partner, dismounts, holds reins of horse while woman or girl mounts her horse. Hold hands and race back across finish line. Failure to hold hands at all times between turning and finish line disqualifies contestants.

GRETNA GREEN "A" (12–15, Adults: Pairs). Same rules and regulations as Gretna Green (see facing page).

HALF EIGHT RACE (All Ages). Pole on turning line, another pole 6 feet from turning line toward starting line. Must make a right or left turn, go between the poles before going across turning line, and race back across finish line. Knocking over pole or not going between poles is a disqualification.

HALF FIGURE 8 STAKE a. All ages; b. May also be run as a pair event for all age groups; or c. As a four-member team event.

a. A pole bending stake is centered on the turning line with a second stake set 30 feet toward the start/finish line and centered in lane. At signal, contestant races to stake on turning line, making a left or right hand turn, races to second stake and makes opposite turn, then returns to stake on turning line, repeating first turn, then races across finish line.

b. To run as a two-person team event: Take the combined scores of each rider. Riders do not need to run in the same heat or at the same time. Should one person of the team disqualify, the team is also disqualified.

c. May also be run as a four-person team where the total time of all members would be combined. These must be run within each age group.

A person could run this for their own individual time in a single event, and their time would be put in on his or her pair event, and also as the team event. Each race paid separately. [1994]

JUST-N-OTHER PAIR RACE (8–11, 12–15, Adults: Pairs). A pole is centered on the turning line with a second pole set 42 feet back toward starting line and centered in lane. Riders mounted, holding a 4"×5' red sock between them. At start, they weave between the two poles, make a left turn around pole on turning

line, weave back through poles and return across finish line. Disqualification for not making a left turn or letting loose of sock at any time before both horses cross finish line.

KANSAS LEADBACK (*All Ages*). Rider starts mounted, races across turning line, dismounts and leads horse back across finish line. Contestant disqualified for not crossing turning line, horse's nose crossing finish line ahead of the shoulder of rider, and for using a third rein or neck rope.

KEG RACE (*All Ages*). Course of six kegs 25 feet apart, centered on lane. Last keg set on turning line. Rider passes first keg to left or right and weaves kegs, turns last keg and returns, weaving kegs back and across finish line. Disqualification for jumping kegs. Kegs to be 5-gallon plastic buckets. [2002]

LITTLE FALLS CIRCLE RACE (*12–15, Adults: Pairs—Man & Woman/Boy & Girl*). Riders mounted, riding double to a chalk circle (3 feet in diameter) centered behind the turning line, lady dismounts in circle, man races back across finish line. Disqualification if toe goes out or lands on the circle.

LITTLE FALLS CIRCLE "A" RACE (*12–15, Adults: Pairs*). Same rules and regulations as Little Falls Circle Race (see above).

MINI PAIR RACE (*under 8, 8–11: Pairs*). Rider mounted, races across turning line where partner is standing. Rider rides to horse handler standing 5 feet behind turn line. Rider and partner pick up 4"×5' red sock positioned on the turning line between them and race to the finish line. Disqualification for letting loose of sock at any time before crossing finish line.

MSCA FLAG RACE (*All Ages*). Buckets of sand are centered on 30-gallon barrels. One barrel placed on turning line, the other 30 feet from the starting line. Three white flags in first bucket and three red flags in bucket at turning line. Contestant passes first barrel, picks up a white flag, races to turning line, exchanges white flag for a red flag. Continues until three red flags are in the first bucket, and three white flags are in the bucket at the turning line. Time ends when contestant crosses finish line. Flags will be 9 inches square with sticks 5/8 inches in diameter and 18 inches long with

pointed end. Buckets to be approximately 12 inches high and 12–14 inches in diameter.

MT COWBOY FLAG RACE (*All Ages*). 2 poles and 2 barrels (open ends up) alternating placed 40 feet apart from the turning line to the starting line. Starting with a barrel on the turn line. A flag to be placed at the tip of each pole. Rider races to 1st pole and picks up the flag with right hand and deposits the flag in the 1st barrel, weaves between 1st barrel and the 2nd pole and picks up flag with left hand deposits flag in 2nd barrel, turning barrel on turn line races home, weaving between 2nd pole and 1st barrel on the way home. Contestant is disqualified for knocking over barrel(s) and/or pole(s), dropping the flag(s) and breaking pattern. [2007]

OLD OPEN BUCKET RACE (*12–15, Adults: Teams of four*). Four mounted contestants. Each team shall have a line of six buckets (approximately 5-gallon). Buckets placed open end down 21 feet apart. Last bucket in line placed on turning line. All lanes to have uniform buckets. At start, rider #1 carrying a baton races to the left side of the first bucket in line and proceeds to bend through and back making just one trip. When the rider crosses the starting line, hands baton to rider #2 who in turn bends through the buckets, starting on the left side of bucket #1. Repeat procedure for riders #3 and #4. Time ends when rider #4 crosses finish line. The baton must be exchanged before the rider receiving it has crossed the start/finish line. Baton shall be a 12-inch length of garden hose. Hitting horse with baton disqualifies team. Team disqualified for knocking over a bucket.

OPEN END BARREL RACE (*12–15, Women, Men*). A 55-gallon barrel with both ends out is placed 10 feet beyond turning line. Mounted rider races to barrel, dismounts, tips barrel on side, crawls through, remounts, and races across finish line.

PAIR POLES (*Under 8, 8–11*). A line shall have four poles, five feet high, 1 to 2 inches in diameter [AMENDED, 1999] and painted white. All lanes to have uniform poles set thirty (30) feet apart with the last pole to be centered on turning line. Both riders will be mounted with one rider at the start line and one rider at turning line. Rider at starting line weaves right or left through the poles and passes a baton to rider

at turning line. The turning line rider weaves back through the poles starting on the same side as the first rider started at the beginning. The baton must be passed behind the turning line. [1996]

PAIR SACK RACE (12–15, *Adults: Pairs*). Partners are mounted holding a 4"×5' red sock, between them. At start, race around 30-gallon barrel centered on turning line and back across finish line. Riders to make a left turn around barrel. Disqualification for knocking over barrel or letting loose of sock at any time before both horses cross the finish line. Race to be run two teams per heat, alternating between lanes #1 and #3 and lanes #2 and #4. [AMENDED, 2007]

POLO TURN (*All Ages*). Rider races to pole centered on turning line, makes a complete circle (one & a half revolutions) around pole, then returns back across finish line. Rider may turn either right or left. [2002]

PONY EXPRESS (*Adults: Teams of four*). Members of each team shall be one-quarter mile apart, all riders to be dismounted at their stations. At signal, rider #1 mounts, races to rider #2. Rider #2 mounts, races to rider #3. Rider #3 mounts, races to #4, who mounts and finishes the relay in front of the judges stand. The baton must be carried throughout. Each rider must pass and receive the baton dismounted. Contestants participating in this event should be getting in place during the preceding event, and committee members assisting with the arena work should be assigned to both stations to instruct the contestants and arrange the relays in the proper position in relation to the first riders to avoid horses crossing in front of each other. Baton shall be a 12-inch piece of garden hose. Hitting horse with baton disqualifies team. Team will be disqualified for any horse that is turned loose during the race.

RESCUE RACE (12–15, *Adults: Pairs*). Standing start. First rider of the team stands with both feet on the ground near saddled horse at the starting line. Partner to be rescued stands behind the turning line in same lane as partner. At signal, rider mounts and races across turning line, picking up partner and races to finish.

RIBBON LETTER RACE (12–15, *Adults: Pairs*). Pole bending pole centered on turning line—envelope is placed at base of pole. First rider starts mounted at starting line, races across the turning line to partner, hands ribbon to person on ground and rider remains behind turning line as partner ties ribbon around pole in shoe knot, then bow tie, reaches down, gets envelope, hands it to rider who races across finish line. Bow must stay up on pole until rider crosses finish line.

ROCK AND ROLL (12–15, *Adults: Teams of four*). Four contestants, one mounted on a bareback horse behind starting line. Other three riders waiting behind the turning line. At signal, rider races across turning line, picks up one rider and races back across starting line. Front rider dismounts. Remaining rider races to next rider in line, picks him up and races back across starting line. Front rider dismounts. Remaining rider races to last rider, picks him up and races back across finish line. Only rider may assist team member that is mounting. Last rider to wear red arm band on arm closest to announcer as he/she starts race.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN ROLL BACK (*All Ages*). A thirty (30) gallon barrel is centered on the turning line. The rider at starting line races to barrel, does a roll back behind the barrel and races back to the finish line. [1996]

SACK RACE (8–11, 12–15: *Pairs*). Both riders mounted riding double, race across turning line where there is a burlap sack. They dismount, hand horse to holder who is standing 5 feet beyond turning line in a 5-foot limes circle. Riders each put one foot in sack and race back across finish line. Time ends when contestants cross line. Sacks are to be laid flat in a uniform manner with the bottom of the sack on turning line and the opening toward the lane judge.

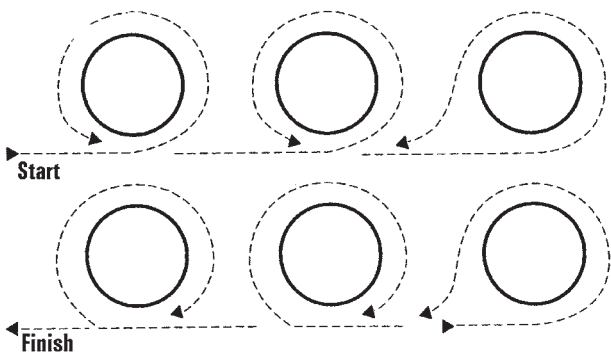
SADDLE AND GO (*Women, Men*). Horses, unsaddled, shall be held by contestants in each lane at starting line. Saddle shall be placed on the ground near right leg of contestant, with blanket pad on top. Cincha or hooks or any conventional western riding equipment will be permitted. At signal, contestant saddles horse properly for conventional western riding, mounts and races around pole bending pole on turning line and back across finish line. Judges shall inspect cinchas.

Latigos must pass through cinch or tackleberry twice with end secured on saddle, all tongues to be in a latigo hole.

SLO BARRELS (*All Ages*). To be run in standard lanes, with three 30-gallon barrels set in a cloverleaf pattern ten feet beyond the turning line. Ten feet between barrels #1 and #2. Barrel #3 is set 25 feet beyond turning line (15 feet beyond line between barrels #1 and #2). Riders race through standard cloverleaf pattern and return across finish line.

SPEED BARRELS (*All Ages*). Three barrels per lane in a straight line, 50 feet apart, the third barrel on the turning line. At start, contestant weaves the barrels down and back, starting weave either left or right of the first barrel.

STRAIGHT BARRELS (*All Ages*). Three barrels centered in lane—55 feet between barrels—last barrel to be centered on turning line. At signal, contestant races to first barrel and proceeds to circle barrel to the left or right, turns second and third (on turning line) barrel in same direction as first and then reverses course, circling last two barrels in opposite direction on return trip. Disqualification for breaking pattern or knocking over barrel. [1994]



TEAM ARENA RACE (*12–15, Adults: Teams of four*). Riders all start mounted. Rider #1 carrying 12-inch baron races to a pole bending stake centered on the turning line, makes a left turn and races back to rider #2 who has moved into

position. Rider #1 passes baton to rider #2. Baton must be passed behind starting line before rider #2 crosses starting line. If rider drops baton, he must pick it up and remount before passing baton. Repeat procedure for riders #3 and #4. Race finishes when rider #4 crosses finish line. Team disqualified for knocking over a pole, hitting horse with baton, running out of lane, or having more than one horse at a time on course between starting and turn lines. Rider #4 to wear a red arm band on arm closest to announcer as he/she starts race.

TEAM RESCUE RACE (12–15, Adults: Teams of four). Three team members wait behind turning line to be rescued. First rider, mounted on saddled horse, races to turning line and rescues team member. Races back across start/finish line, rescued partner dismounts. Repeats for other team members. Last rider does not have to dismount. Last rider to wear a red arm band on arm closest to announcer as he/she starts race.

TEAM SPEED BARRELS (12–15, Adults: Teams of four). All riders mounted at start. At signal, first rider carrying baton races through speed barrel pattern (see speed barrel description) and passes baton to rider #2 who has moved into position. Baton must be passed behind starting line before rider #2 crosses start/finish line. Repeat for riders #3 and #4. Rider #4 to wear a red arm band on arm closest to announcer as he/she starts race.

300-YARD HORSE RACE (12–15, Women, Men). Horses to be started from a standing start, lined up in a straight line facing the same direction as the race is being run. Horses are to be ridden with western saddle. Saddles used by adults to weigh a minimum of 20 pounds. There shall be no more than eight (8) horses run at one time. If there are more than eight (8) entries it shall be run in heats and each heat timed. Contestants must draw for positions on the track.

TIRE RACE (Under 8, 8–11, 12–15). An automobile tire is placed ten feet beyond turning line for each contestant. Tires to be uniform size. Contestants race to turning line, dismount, crawl through tire, remount, and race back to finish line. Tires to be anchored by a rope with 12-inch clear-

ance from ground to a stake driven level with the ground. For Under 8 and 8–11, a spotter standing 5 feet behind the tire to be used for safety assistance only—if assisted, rider will be disqualified.

TOMAHAWK RACE (*All Ages*). A barrel open end up placed 30 feet from starting line, second barrel closed end up placed on turning line with a 15-inch length of garden hose, with a white mark 6 inches from the end of hose, placed on top and extending 6 inches from edge of barrel. At start, contestant races to barrel #2 on turning line, picks up hose and on return deposits it in barrel #1. Rider must keep barrels to left or right at all times.

TWO BARREL FLAG RACE (*8–11, 12–15, Women, Men*). Equipment needed: two 30-gallon barrels painted white, per lane, two 5-foot wooden poles (1" to 2" in diameter [AMENDED, 1999]) with a colored flag on one pole and another colored flag on the second pole. Flags to be two different colors and 9 inches square. At signal, rider races to first barrel 30 feet from starting line, picks up stake with colored flag and races to second barrel at turning line, deposits stake with colored flag into barrel and picks up stake with a different colored flag, races back to first barrel and deposits that stake with different flag, then races back to finish line. Rider must keep barrels to right or left at all times. Contestants will raise right or left arm when coming into arena to tell the arena crew what side of barrel they will pick up stakes with flags. Approximately 1 to 2 inches of dirt will be put in bottom of first barrel. Contestants are disqualified for hitting horse with property, knocking over barrel, dropping stake, and breaking the pattern.

TWO BARREL POLE RACE (*All Ages*). Two barrels are placed 60 feet from starting line, 10 feet between the barrels (all measurements made to the center of barrel) and 10 feet from each barrel to lane divider lines. Three pole bending poles, the first placed in the center of the lane on the turning line, and the other two poles 21 feet apart toward starting line. Contestant races to either barrel, making a right or left turn around the first barrel, then the opposite turn around the second barrel, weaves poles both ways, then races back between barrels to finish line.

TRES RACE (*All Ages*). Two poles placed 10 feet from each lane line and 10 feet from each other, a third pole placed 10 feet from turning line, centered in the middle of the lane. Rider races down the lane across the turning line, turns the 1st pole, the rider then goes down the lane and turns the pole centered in the middle of the lane (the opposite turn from the 1st pole), the ride back to the 3rd pole on the turning line, turns pole, rider then races home. Rider may go right or left. Disqualification for knocking over pole(s) or touching pole(s) with hand.

UNDRESS AND DRESS RACE (*8–11, 12–15, Women, Men*). Horse, saddle, bridle, and rider. Rider has hat, shirt, pants, and boots, with a bathing suit underneath. Horse must be kept in motion while rider removes hat, shirt, pants, and boots and then puts them on again. Disqualification if horse stops or rider drops any article.

UNTIE RIBBON RACE (*8–11: Pairs*). Riders, mounted double, race to turning line where one dismounts. Dismounted rider unties a red sock tied in a bow in the middle of a pole (centered on turning line) and hands to mounted rider. Mounted rider races back across finish line.

WESTERN JUMPING (*All Ages*). A plastic pole 15 feet in length 3 inches in diameter is set on standards a minimum of 12 inches and a maximum of 18 inches off the ground and centered 60 feet from the starting line. Standards to be placed at each end of the pole. Three stakes—the first placed on the turning line with the others set 21 feet apart toward the starting line. Contestant races to the pole, jumps the pole, weaves through the stakes both ways, either left or right, returns to jump the pole, and crosses the finish line. Disqualifications for steadying a pole with hand or knocking down a property.
[AMENDED, 2004]

WESTERN RELAY (*Open: Teams of four*). First rider to wear red arm band on arm closest to announcer as he/she starts race. Four 30-gallon barrels are placed on four corners of arena. Barrel #1 placed inside of starting line corner of lane #1, barrel #2 placed inside of turning line corner of lane #1, barrel #3 placed inside of turning line corner of lane #4, barrel #4 placed inside of starting line corner of lane #4. Start/finish

line is between barrel #1 and arena fence. All riders enter center of arena. Rider #1 to start between barrels #2 and #1, races around arena, outside of barrels, and passes baton to rider #2 between barrels #2 and #1, continuing until all riders have completed course. Disqualifications for knocking over barrel, dropping baton or hitting horse with baton, failure to pass baton before start/finish line, and for crossing line between barrel #4 and arena fence after completing course. Baton may be a 12-inch long white garden hose or plastic.

MSCA RACES APPROVED FOR LOCAL COMPETITION

BALLOON BUSTING. Balloon attached to shoulder with one yard of heavy twine. Balloon must be free at all times (not to be tucked under arm, etc.) Object is to pinch balloon of other contestants and bust it, while keeping own balloon intact. Last contestant with filled balloon wins. Contestants must remain in area directed by judges. Riding out of specified area disqualifies.

BOOT RACE. Riders mounted bareback and barefooted or stocking footed, race to turning line where his/her boots are. Contestant dismounts, puts on boots and leads horse back across finish line.

CHAPS & SPURS RACE. Both contestants to wear chaps and spurs. Woman or girl is mounted, man or boy on foot, both at starting line. Both race to turning line. Woman or girl hands reins of horse to a holder who is standing 5 feet beyond turning line in a 5-foot limed circle, races on foot back across finish line. Man or boy mounts and races across finish line. Time to be determined when slower of the two partners crosses finish line.

DISMOUNTED DEVILS COWHIDE. Mounted contestant pulls empty cowhide around 30-gallon barrel placed on turning line, where the hide rider is standing behind turning line. Hide rider mounts hide and is pulled back across finish line. Must make a right turn around barrel.

EGG RACE. Contestant races to turning line where a spoon and an egg are placed on the ground. Rider dismounts, picks up egg with spoon, holding spoon by handle. Rider mounts with egg in spoon and returns across finish line, holding spoon far enough out on handle so judges can see that no finger or thumb touches egg. Fresh eggs are to be used.

GEAR ADJUSTING RACE. Equipment consisting of bridle (no blanket) and saddle is placed at 20-foot intervals, in that order, in a line. Contestant starts leading the horse by neckrope or halter shank to bridle, which she puts on horse, then continues to the saddle which is cinched and secured in the usual manner. She then mounts and rides to finish line. Judges will be critical of adjusting gear. Any commonly accepted latigo tie may be used.

HANDKERCHIEF RACE. Pair, mounted on separate horses races to turning line where there is a barrel and pole bending stake with a handkerchief on each. Lady or girl picks up handkerchief off the pole bending stake and man or boy picks up handkerchief off the barrel. They tie handkerchiefs together and each holding one end race back across finish line. They must be holding ends of handkerchief when crossing turning line. Disqualified if the handkerchiefs come untied or either end is dropped.

LAZY EGG RACE. Contestants mounted, have egg in spoon of uniform size at starting line. Contestant races to the turning line, makes a turn around a 30-gallon barrel placed on turning line. Races across finish line. Contestant must hold spoon far enough out on handle so judges can see that no fingers or thumb touches the egg. Fresh eggs to be used. Dropping egg disqualifies contestant.

MILK RIVER SPECIAL. Riders start mounted, race across turning line where rider dismounts and picks up a canvas dam (dam not rolled), mounts and races across finish line with canvas dam. Dam size will be 8 feet by 6 feet, with uniform stick going through it. Dam to be of uniform material-canvas or plastic.

MUSICAL CHAIRS. Chairs are placed in a large circle. There should be one less chair than contestants. When music starts,

all riders gallop. When music stops, they dismount at once and lead horse to nearest chair where contestant remains seated until music starts. Those not securing a chair are eliminated. One chair is removed before music starts again. Riders shall be immediately disqualified by judges for any of the following reasons: (1) Failure to comply immediately with requests of judges. (2) Grasping chair before dismounting. (3) Unsportsmanlike conduct.

When there are just four contestants remaining in the game they will remain dismounted, lead their horses toward four kegs from a starting line 75 feet away, these last four are timed by timers.

MUSICAL ROPES. A cable is stretched across the arena above the starting line with lengths of rope attached to the cable by rings. Riders are mounted at starting line, when music starts all ride away from ropes. When music stops, they turn and ride to line, grab rope. A rope is taken away until all but one contestant is eliminated.

PACK SADDLE RACE (*Adults: Pairs*). Rider, mounted and holding pack horse stands at starting line. At start, leads unsaddled pack horse, to partner who is waiting at opposite end of arena with pack saddle complete and packs. The packs consist of two 100-pound potato sacks filled with straw. Partners saddle pack horse in conventional manner. After tying packs in place (using any method of tie) the rider, leading pack horse, races to finish line. Packs must cross finish line intact and pack horse must not be over a horse length behind rider.

POP RACE. Woman or girl standing behind turning line in lane opposite her partner. Man or boy mounted at starting line with a half bottle of water in hand and holding his partner's horse. Man or boy races to his lady or girl, dismounts, lady or girl drinks all the water and mounts her horse. Man or boy mounts and they race back across finish line holding hands. Disqualified for not holding hands all the time between turning and finish lines.

RING SPEARING. Five standards from each of which is suspended a harness ring about 2½ to 3½ inches in diameter will be placed in a line 50 feet apart. The start will be 50 feet

before the first standard and the finish 50 feet beyond the last standard. The course will thus be 100 yards long. The contestant will be furnished a spear about 2½ feet long. The contestant will ride the course at full speed and attempt to spear the rings off the standards. Each rider will be timed. The course must be ridden in 10 seconds or faster or rider will be disqualified. The rider getting the most rings wins. In case of a tie, the fastest time wins.

ROPING SACK RACE. A firmly stuffed sack with a flat bottom so it will stand up, to be placed 10 feet beyond turning line. Rider races to turning line without crossing it, ropes sack and races back across finish line. Time stops when sack crosses line. Rider allowed two loops. Disqualification if rider loses sack or turning line is crossed.

RUSTLERS IN COWBOY CAMP (*Men*). Riders unsaddle and unbridle ponies at starting line. They tie lariat around pony's neck for picketing, holding one end. (Lariats should be at least 25 feet long, but length may be shortened for sake of safety if number of contestants is large.) Rider lies down with saddle for pillow (seat up), and uses folded saddle blanket for cover. At signal, riders arise, saddle up in conventional manner and race around pole bending stake on turning line and back across finish line. Lariats must be coiled and fastened to saddle. No part of lariat shall be permitted to drag. One end may be left tied around horse's neck.

SPEED AND ACTION. At starting line, two barrels are set 12 feet apart and 12 feet toward turning line, two more barrels 12 feet apart. On the turning line, there are three barrels 3 feet apart. Contestant races between the four barrels, races through the three barrels, returns to the center of the barrel box, dismounts, leaves horse and on foot races around the outside of all four barrels, reenters barrel box at same point, and leads horse across starting line. Time stops as rider crosses line leading horse. Contestant is disqualified if horse leaves the barrel box or if a barrel is knocked over. Contestant may make right or left turns.

SPUD RACE. Contestant mounted at starting line 30 feet from pile of three (3) potatoes. Each contestant is given a long spear. Contestant races to potatoes, spears a potato, races

to tire placed on turning line at the opposite end of arena, drops potato in tire. Continues until all spuds are in tire and races across finish line with spear in hand. New potatoes of uniform size to be used for each heat. Riders must keep tire and potatoes to right or left at all times. Spear must be six feet in length, 1 to 2 inches in diameter with metal point on end of spear. Potatoes to be dusted with lime.

SURPRISE PACKAGE RACE. One package for each contestant is placed on turning line. Riders race to line of packages, dismount, open package, put on garments, mount and return to finish line.

TRAILER RACE (12–15, Women, Men). At signal, rider opens and closes gate coming into arena, turns figure eight around two barrels, races to trailer, stops, backs three (3) steps, dismounts and loads horse into trailer. Time ends when horse's hind feet are completely in the trailer. Judge at the trailer tells rider when horse has backed three steps and also signals timer when horse is completely in the trailer. Time limit of one (1) minute. Trailer for the race will be picked by O-Mok-See committee and shall not have a divider bar. 30-gallon barrels to be used.

WATER RACE. Buckets filled with water shall be placed at one point. Empty jars will be placed about 25 yards distant. Contestants shall be furnished with cups of the same size. Contestants start near bucket, fill cup from bucket, ride to jar, empty water into it and repeat until jar is full. Contestant rides with jar to judges. First to fill jar wins.

WHEEL BARROW RACE. Man or boy rides to his partner, who is standing beside a wheel barrow beyond turning line. Man dismounts lifts lady or girl into the wheel barrow and pushes across finish line with lady or girl leading her partner's horse.

BAREBACK HORSEMANSHIP (All Ages). Horses to be shown at a walk, trot, and lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Contestants must work both ways of the

ring at all three gaits to demonstrate their ability with different leads. The judge shall have the right to ask for additional work from any contestant. The judge must ask that the horse be backed. Rider shall not be required to dismount for any reason. Horses to be reversed to the inside (away from the rail). Horses may be required to reverse at the walk or trot at the discretion of the judge, but shall not be asked to reverse at the lope. Horses to be shown with a western bridle of sound construction. A hackamore (bosal), curb, snaffle, halfbreed, or spade bit is permissible. No wire curbs and bits, or chin straps narrower than ½-inch will be permitted. Chain curbs are permissible, but must meet with approval of judge and lie flat against the jaw of horse. Rider shall wear a western hat, clothing, and boots. Chaps or other loose clothing interfering with judge's view of leg and foot position is not allowed. The rider shall maintain a firm and balanced grip from the upper calf to the crotch and will be in contact with the horse's back at all times. Entries shall be penalized for being on the wrong lead. Reins to be held in one hand and must not be changed. Hand to be around reins one finger between reins permitted. While in motion, rider's hands shall be clear of horse—the free hand must not support the rider in any manner. The conformation, manners, and way of going of the horse are not to be considered unless they demonstrate superior horsemanship on the part of the contestant. Class will be judged on horsemanship (85%), and appointments/grooming (15%).

REINING STOCKHORSE (*All Ages*). Open to horses of any breed, serviceably sound, and of stock horse type. Entries shall be shown with a stock saddle without tapederos. A bosal or cavesson-type nose band, martingale, choke rope, or tie-down is prohibited. A flat curb chain at least ½-inch wide is permitted, but no wire, metal, or rawhide device may be used in conjunction with the chin strap. Curb, spade, or halfbreed bits are permitted. Only one hand may be used on reins—fingers between reins not permitted. Spurs shall not be used forward of the cinch. While horse is in motion, rider's hands shall be clear of horse and saddle. Horses shall enter the ring at a walk, taking a walk, taking a jog-trot and slow lope upon request. Rider shall start the pattern with a figure eight executed at a lope two or three times. Horses should be

able to change leads both front and rear. Entries shall make a straight sliding stop at both ends of the arena, then run to center of arena and make a straight sliding stop, then back up in a straight line 10 to 15 feet. Horses shall be brought up to judge, then make quarter turn to the right, and half turn to left and right. Horses are to be on grounds to be judged for rein, conformation, manners, and appointments.

WESTERN PLEASURE (*All Ages*). Open to horses of any breed. To be shown at a walk, trot, and lope both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Entries shall be penalized for being on the wrong lead at the lope. A curb, halfbreed, or spade bit is permissible, but a martingale or tie-down is prohibited. Riders shall wear a western hat, cowboy boots, and carry a rope. Chaps and spurs are optional. A flat curb at least ½-inch wide is permitted, but no wire, metal, or rawhide device may be used in conjunction with the chin strap. To be judged on performance (60%), conformation (30%), and appointments (10%).

WESTERN TRAIL HORSES OPEN (*All Ages*). Open to horses of any breed. To be shown at a walk, trot, and lope both ways of the ring on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Special emphasis shall be placed on the walk. There shall be no discrimination against any type of western bit, but no hackamore, hackamore bit, or other device shall be allowed. Horses may be shown with roached manes. Performance will consist of opening, passing through, and closing a gate without losing control of the gate, and traveling over and through obstacles simulating natural conditions encountered along the trail. Entries shall be judged on performance with the emphasis on manners (60%), appointments/equipment/neatness (silver will not count extra) (20%), and conformation (20%).
